The reviewers noted that the Caribbean studies program presents an opportunity "to envision a more robust way of encouraging students to deepen their study of various languages" and encouraged coordination with other FAS departments (Spanish and French in particular); they also suggested exploring a "consortium model" of	The Centre's director will continue previously established dialogues with the Department of Spanish and Portuguese (which now houses the Latin American Studies program) and the Department of French to explore the possibilities of delivering collaborative courses, which will deepen the exposure of Caribbean Studies Students to non-anglophone cultures in the region and beyond. Currently, there are two joint courses with Latin American Studies, which is housed in the Department of Spanish & Portuguese (JLN327H1 Regional Perspectives on the Hispanic Caribbean; JLN427H1 Advanced Topics: The Hispanic Caribbean) that have offered students further exposure to different linguistic cultures within the Caribbean. While there is no progress yet on offering a course in Creole, the CSC EDU proposal cites this possibility in its five-year complement plan, which includes identifying a scholar with expertise in this area. The unit will continue to explore its options in offering language courses. The Centre for Caribbean Studies has decided that it will not pursue increased language program requirements.	N
